

INTRODUCTION

ALPHABETS Preschool Center is a proud member of the Asbury Park Early Childhood Education Consortium. To enter Alphabets your child must be three or four years of age on or by October 1st and must be able to manage on one nap per day.

Our Mission Statement:

Alphabets Preschool Center is dedicated to providing a safe, healthy, loving and stimulating environment for Asbury Park children 3 to 5 years old to experience optimal growth in all areas of development; and to promoting a love of learning through family involvement and the use of an age appropriate curriculum that addresses your child's individual needs.

GOALS AND PHILOSOPHY OF PROGRAM

ALPHABETS Preschool Center is dedicated to the total development of your child. We are working towards the growth of the WHOLE Child. No ONE philosophy is followed exclusively. We take our best practices from early childhood researchers. We do not mold the child to a philosophy of education; we choose instead what works best with your individual child, so that he/she may experience optimum growth at this extremely important stage of life.

At ALPHABETS, the child is the curriculum. We start from where your child is, and we guide him/her towards materials and experiences which will enhance growth in all areas of development: social, emotional, cognitive, and physical. We do not "grade" or compare children on any scale, but we do chart their development and growth through their stages of learning.

Learning is a pleasant and happy experience for children at ALPHABETS. They are allowed much freedom to move, to choose and to exercise using their own judgment within a structured and carefully prepared environment, supervised by caring and knowledgeable professionals.

<u>HOURS</u>

ALPHABETS Preschool Center is open from 7A.M. to 5:30 P.M., Monday through Friday. An Academic Program of Instruction is offered from September through June. A Comprehensive Summer Camp Program is offered July and August. This camp program features our own summer "specials."

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE TIME

Asbury Park School District requires all children attending any Asbury Park Preschool to attend the ENTIRE DAY of school. Alphabets Preschool Center's school day is 9:00 AM-3:00 PM.

The APSD school day begins promptly at 9:00 A.M. Students WITHOUT WRAP services must enter Alphabets Preschool Center between **8:45** A.M. - **9:00** A.M.

*The APSD school day ends at 3:00 P.M. In compliance with Asbury Park School District Policy, students should not be picked up before 3:00 PM. Students WITHOUT WRAP services must be picked up at the end of the day from 3:00 PM - 3:15 PM.



Students MUST be in school by 9:00 AM.



Students will not be permitted entry after 9:00 AM.



Entering late disrupts breakfast, prevents teachers from starting the day and distracts other students.

Students are permitted to enter 8:45 AM to 9:00 AM. Please Note: Calling to inform the staff that you are running late DOES NOT give you permission to enter after 9:00 AM.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS

Alphabets offers a full day, five day, 12 month program of instruction for three to five year olds. The basic full day is from 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. Extended hours are offered from 7:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. and from 3:00 P.M. to 5:30 P.M.

There are two full day three-year old classrooms and two full day four-year old classrooms.

Three through five year olds who attend Alphabets Preschool Center that reside in Asbury Park are funded through the Asbury Park School District. There are no fees to parents of children enrolled in our programs who reside in Asbury Park from 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.

Alphabets Preschool Center provides <u>Wraparound Child Care</u> for students who meet the state eligibility requirements. This program is funded by the New Jersey Department of Human Services. This wraparound program provides care to your child for the following:

Any hours between 7:00 A.M and 9:00 A.M.

Any hours between 3:00 P.M. and 5:30 P.M.

Any hours that Alphabets is open when the Asbury Park School District is closed.

Extended year/Summer program beginning in July through the end of August.

To be determined eligible for the wraparound child care, parents/applicants must be employed or in school/training program for a minimum of 25 hours per week, or a combination of work and school that equals at least 25 hours a week. In addition, families must meet the income eligibility requirements for this program. There may be a co-pay assigned for these services.

Families may purchase wraparound childcare services if they are not eligible through the state funding.

CURRICULUM AT ALPHABETS PRESCHOOL CENTER

Alphabets Preschool Center utilizes three programs of instruction that have been provided to us through the Asbury Park School District.

1. CREATIVE CURRICULUM

The anchor curriculum is the Creative Curriculum for Preschool. This award winning preschool curriculum is fully aligned with the New Jersey State Early Learning Standards. This program uses exploration and discovery as tools for learning.

The Creative Curriculum enables children to develop confidence, creativity and lifelong critical thinking skills. In addition, this program offers daily opportunities to individualize instruction, helping teachers to meet the needs of every type of learner while at the same time addresses all the important areas of learning, from social –emotional and math to technology and the arts by incorporating them throughout the day.

Additionally, it offers daily, built –in opportunities for observation, helping teachers and administrators clearly see the strong relationship between curriculum and assessment.

2. BIG DAY PRE-K

The Asbury Park School District Early Childhood Department has added a supplemental foundational skill program through the daily infusion of Big Day Pre-K. This initiative aims to offer students a comprehensive instructional program that is seamlessly embedded into the regular school day. Through inclusion of Big Day Pre-K, children will be provided with countless opportunities to build foundational skills in all content areas, with a specific focus on literacy skills, such as letter identification, letter-sound recognition and letter formation.

These core foundational skills are explicitly taught in a developmentally appropriate manner through scaffolded extended play. Children are given several chances to practice these skills through play in their natural environment. The Big Day for Pre-K program consistently uses research-based practices that are direct and intentional so children master core academic skills. The mastery of these skills will ensure kindergarten readiness, as lessons are individualized-based on data and children's learning needs.

3. SECOND STEP

The Second Step Early Learning Curriculum is a social emotional curriculum that promotes success in the early learning classroom, school readiness, and social and life success.

It does this by directly teaching children the skills that strengthen their ability to:

- Learn
- Have empathy
- Mange emotions
- Make friends
- Solve problems

We are proud to offer these three curriculum programs that focus on the whole child. By integrating all the different things that these programs bring to our instruction we are able to deliver a beautiful opportunity for your child to experience optimal growth in all areas of their development.

MEALS

All meals at Alphabets Preschool Center are free of charge to our families. Meals are served "family style".

<u>Breakfast</u>: is served daily from 8:30 A.M. - 9:00 A.M. Breakfast menus are distributed and posted monthly.

Breakfast consists of:

- A.) Milk as a beverage and/or on a cereal.
- B.) A serving of fruit, fruit juice or vegetable.
- C.) A serving of enriched or whole grain bread, a bread product, meat or meat alternative.

<u>Lunch</u>: is served daily from 11:20 A.M. – 11:50 A.M.

Our lunch menu is posted and distributed monthly. Please be sure we have on file all information pertaining to your child's food restrictions or special dietary customs/practices. WE NEED TO BE AWARE OF ALL FOOD ALLERGIES and medical documentation MUST be provided.

Our Hot Lunch consists of:

- A.) Milk as a beverage.
- B.) One source of protein.
- C.) Two fruit servings <u>OR</u> two vegetables <u>OR</u> one fruit serving <u>AND</u> one vegetable serving.
- D.) One serving of bread or bread products, often whole wheat or whole grain.

Please note:

- 1% Milk is served daily to all students unless a medical condition exists as documented by your child's pediatrician.
- Children need to arrive to our program by 9:00 A.M. daily in order to be included in the hot lunch program for the day. Please call the school by 9:00 A.M. if you know your child will be arriving late due to a previously scheduled appointment, so that he/she may be included for lunch.
- Because we are on the national USDA food program, we cannot accept meals or snacks brought in from home. Please do not send your child to school with food of any kind, unless required due to a medical condition (see restrictions) or for a special occasion (see birthdays).

<u>Snacks</u>: are included in the afternoon session. We avoid serving snacks that have a high sugar content, such as candy or soda. Our snacks are nutritionally balanced and many are coordinated with our curriculum and our studies.

SIGN-IN

CHILDREN MUST BE ACCOMPANIED INTO THE BUILDING BY AN ADULT UPON ARRIVAL. The accompanying adult needs to sign in the child's time of arrival on the "SIGN-IN" SHEET. You will be instructed on this procedure at the time of enrollment. This Sign-In Sheet is extremely important in case of fire drills or emergencies when we need to have an accurate count of children present at the Center.

Please instruct other adults who are bringing in your child as to this procedure. Your child must also be "SIGNED-OUT" at the time of departure.

Parents who are too busy to accompany children into the school will be asked to make other child care arrangements.

Children who ride the bus will be signed in/out by our caregivers.

ABSENCES

If your child will not be coming to the center on any day, whether because of illness, vacation or just to take a personal day with you, please call the center **by 9:00 A.M.** so our staff know how many children to plan for.

It is the parent's responsibility to call the center by 9:00 A.M.

Children enrolled at Alphabets are expected to maintain an 80% level of attendance = at least four days of attendance every week. This is an Asbury Park School District policy.

3-Day ABSENCES

Children who are absent due to illness are expected to provide documentation through a doctor's note for any absence three days or longer.

Extended periods of absence (more than 2 consecutive days) need to be discussed with the Director on an individual basis. **Frequent, non-excused absences are not acceptable.**

LATE ENTRY

All children are REQUIRED to be signed in to our program by 9:00 A.M. on a daily basis. Children will not be allowed entry after 9:00 A.M. If you anticipate that your child will be arriving after 9:00 A.M., you can call and **REQUEST** clearance for a 1:00 P.M. late entry from the Director. You may request arrangements to enter our program at 1:00 P.M.; *however*, *late entry is not acceptable on a regular basis*.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS / GENESIS STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Our preschool program is included in the *Genesis Student Information System* notification system. This system involves phone calls and/or texts to alert parents of anything occurring in the school district. These phone calls and/or texts will cover everything from school closings and notifications for snow days to district activities and events. In your APSD registration packet, there is a form regarding the Genesis System where you provide contact information to be added to this notification system.

<u>Bad weather closings:</u> If the Asbury Park School District is announced closed for bad weather (snow, storms, hurricanes, etc.) Alphabets Preschool Center will also be closed. *Please do not call the school to find out if we are closed.*

10:00 Delayed Openings: Alphabets opens at our regularly scheduled hours of 7:00 A.M. for the Asbury Park School District 10:00 A.M. delayed openings. If your child is eligible for wraparound services, you have the option of having your child attend 7:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. on those days. If you do not have wraparound services, your child will need to be dropped off at 10:00 A.M or arrive on the bus at 10:00 A.M. on these days.

12:30 Dismissal ½ Day Closings: Alphabets remains open regular hours from 7:00 A.M. to 5:30 P.M. during the Asbury Park School District 12:30 ½ day closings. If your child is eligible for wraparound services, you have the option of having your child attend until 5:30 P.M. on those ½ day sessions for Asbury Park School District. If you do not have wraparound services, your child will need to be picked up by 12:30 P.M. or take the bus home at 12:30 P.M. on ½ days.

<u>Holiday closings:</u> The Asbury Park School District and Alphabets Preschool Center each have their own calendar for the school year. Alphabets is open on several days that the school district is closed. If your child is eligible for wraparound services, your child may attend on those days that we are open and the school district is closed. Follow both calendars to identify those days. If your child does not have wraparound services, he/she may not attend on those days.

WHAT TO BRING TO SCHOOL

Your child should always have one extra set of clothing on hand at school in case of bathroom accidents or wet weather. Please be sure to always return an extra set of clothing when the one on hand is used. Also try to be sure that the extra clothing is seasonally appropriate. You may be asked to pick up your child from school if we have nothing available and a change of clothing is necessary.

Please provide your child with a SMALL blanket or twin sheet for naptime. This is kept here at school in your child's personal cubby. We wash blankets monthly and Alphabets cot sheets weekly.

It is your responsibility to <u>label all clothing and other personal items</u> including mittens, hats, gloves, sweaters, etc. which belong to your child. ALPHABETS is not responsible for the loss of any such items. The purchase of a permanent black magic marker is highly recommended.

- ** Please do not send children's toys from home without prior permission from the teacher.
- ** It is recommended that your child not wear expensive or sentimental jewelry.

If your child rides the bus, please provide him/her with a labeled backpack to bring papers to and from home and school.

RESTRICTIONS

INFORM US OF ANY SPECIAL NEEDS YOUR CHILD MAY HAVE CONCERNING FOOD AND DIET, ANY KNOWN ALLERGIES, OR RESTRICTIONS ON ACTIVITY AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT. PLEASE KEEP US CURRENT THROUGHOUT THE YEAR WITH NEW INFORMATION.

PLEASE NOTE: IN ADDITION, ALL SPECIAL NEEDS/RESTRICTIONS MUST BE SUPPORTED WITH MEDICAL DOCUMENTATION.

LATE PICK-UP POLICY

ALPHABETS closes promptly at 5:30 P.M. and no caregivers are scheduled to care for your children after that time.

ALPHABETS Preschool Center will follow the State of New Jersey's Department of Human Services Manual of Standards for child care centers in this situation:

"Whenever the parent(s) and/or other person(s) authorized by the parent(s) fails to pick up the child one hour or more after closing time, a center staff member shall call the Division's 24-hour Child Abuse Hot Line (800-792-8610) or NJ Dept. of Child and Families 24-hour Child Absue Hot Line (877-652-2873) to seek assistance in caring for the child until his/her parent(s) or other person(s) authorized by the parent(s) is available to care for the child."

Please respect that our caregivers need to go home at their scheduled time and cannot stay longer to care for your child. Please be on time. Parents who pick up children later than 5:30 PM will be asked to change their contract accordingly.

MAILBOXES

Each child is assigned a "mailbox" in the lobby. Please check it daily for artwork and projects completed by your child at school. All memos and correspondence from the Director and teachers about upcoming special events, holiday parties, fund-raisers, and notes to parents will be placed in your child's mailbox. This is an important means of communication between teachers and parents so please take some time at the beginning and end of each day to "read the mail".

Children who will use bus transportation are asked to provide a labeled backpack to carry their mail home from school.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Transportation services from September to June are available through the Asbury Park School District to all students enrolled at Alphabets who live outside of a 1/2 mile radius of the school. Transportation services are offered to all students for the months of July and August through Alphabets Preschool Center. You have the option of using these transportation services for the full day program, from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, or providing your own for extended hours.

Families who utilize bus transportation must maintain good communication with Alphabets Preschool Center throughout the year. Family involvement is a strong component of our program. A lack of communication between family and school will not be accepted for children who are using our bus services.

The Alphabets <u>Child Release Policy</u> is the same for children using bus services as it is for children being picked up from our center. Pick up people must be listed on the child's <u>Medical Authorization Form</u> and identification must be provided. <u>There are no exceptions.</u>

BUS POLICIES

- Your child must be ready to board the bus at their approximate pick-up time in the morning. An adult must bring your child directly to the bus in the morning to help them board. The bus may be several minutes early or delayed on any given day, depending on the number of stops, so please take this into consideration and allow for some flexibility in your daily routine. The bus driver cannot sit for extended periods and will not call to inform you that the bus has arrived, so please be prompt. The use of the horn to signal arrival is not allowed by the police department. If you miss the bus in the morning, you are responsible for calling Alphabets to notify us and request to bring your child into school. You will need to arrive by 9:00A.M. Please do not bring your child to school if you have not notified Alphabets first.
- Children who ride the bus must be able and willing to have their seatbelts on at all times. This is MANDATORY. A child who will not wear his/her seatbelt at all times will not be allowed to use bus service. Children who ride the bus will be expected to behave appropriately at all times.
- An <u>adult from the pick up authorization list</u> must receive the child directly from the bus in the afternoon. In the event that an authorized adult is not present to receive the child, the child will return to Alphabets on the bus for pick up at the school by an appropriate person. If you miss the bus in the afternoon, you must send an <u>adult from the pick up authorization list</u> to Alphabets to pick up your child.
- It is the parent's responsibility to call Alphabets at (732) 775-1582 as early as possible to notify us if your child will not need bus service that day. PLEASE NOTE: The bus is not a taxi service and we will limit your requests to change bus plans for the day.
- Bus services are provided by the Asbury Park School District September through June. Alphabets is not responsible for these services in any manner.
- Please, DO NOT send money, medication or anything of importance or value to school with your child on the bus.

BUS SAFETY

- Please be sure, especially in the winter, that your walkways are clear of safety hazards such as ice, snow, etc., so that the children have clear paths from our bus to your home.
- In the case of inclement weather, you will be notified as early as possible if our bus transportation will not be available for the day.
- Please keep the school informed of current changes in emergency contact information.

DRESS

Your child will be participating in many fun and exciting activities which tend to be very messy, such as art, sand, and water play and outdoor play. **DO NOT** send him/her in clothes that you would not wish soiled.

Also, please be careful in choosing clothing that helps children to be potty independent. Difficult belts and buckles and overalls often prohibit students from making it to the bathroom on time.

Please note: Alphabets is not responsible for children's personal jewelry. We prefer that children do not wear expensive jewelry or jewelry with sentimental value.

Alphabets Preschool Center follows the Asbury Park School District Uniform Policy from September through June. Please refer to the policy in your enrollment packet for details.

MISCELLANEOUS

- DO NOT SEND TOYS FROM HOME. Please arrange any special displays in advance with the Director.
- Be sure to notify us if you have a change in address or phone number.
- Do not park in our neighbor's driveway.
- Please do not park in the designated bus space in the front of our building from 8:30 AM 9:30 AM and between 2:30 PM -3:30 PM. The Asbury Park Police Department will issue you a parking ticket if you are parked in the bus loading zone.
- Parents are responsible for children's behavior at their time of departure and at all special events planned at the school. Please cooperate with us in having your child follow school rules in your presence.
- Please help maintain ALPHABETS attractive grounds by using sidewalks and garbage receptacles for your trash.
- DO NOT let children open the front door or push against it!

BIRTHDAYS

We celebrate each child's birthday during one of our snack times by serving a food from our menu that is especially popular and singing "Happy Birthday".

In addition if you choose, you can provide mini cupcakes or cookies for our birthday celebrations. We ask that you DO NOT provide a cake as it is difficult to serve to the children. Birthday cupcakes or cookies MUST be brought in to school by 9:00 A.M. on the day of the planned celebration.

We cannot accommodate parent requests to attend their child's birthday celebration in the classroom.

Please Note: Due to food allergies, we ask that you clear all ingredients for birthday snack celebrations with the desk staff. Store bought goodies are preferred.

FAMILY PARTICIPATION

ALPHABETS welcomes parent/family participation in our program and we want you to feel free to visit as often as you wish. The door is always open for you. Families in Asbury Park have a choice of preschools in the Asbury Park Preschool Early Childhood Education Consortium as long as there is space. All of the Early Childhood centers in the Consortium utilize the Creative Curriculum program of instruction, as well as the Second Step Curriculum and Big Day PreK program.

When your child is enrolled at ALPHABETS, the school, teachers, parents, and the Director become a team, all working toward the total development of the child. Alphabets has certain parent requirements to keep this team working together smoothly. Please take note of these parent requirements in making Alphabets your choice of preschools for your child.

At Alphabets, we do REQUIRE parents to do the following:

1. Parent Teacher Conferences

Conferences are held twice a year, in the fall and spring and also as requested. At parent/teacher conferences you will review and discuss your child's development and plan for optimal growth. Parent/Teacher conferences are a requirement for ALL families. They are also a wonderful opportunity for families to obtain individualized information pertaining to their child's strengths and needs. A Meet n' Greet is planned yearly for parents to meet our staff and learn about our program.

2. Open Communication

Families must maintain communication with staff in an ongoing, consistent manner. It is important for all partners in this team to communicate as often as is necessary to ensure that the child's school experience is a positive one. ALPHABETS welcomes and encourages such communication. On-going communication between parents and staff is *REQUIRED* at ALPHABETS.

3. Maintain positive and professional working relationships with Alphabets staff.



At Alphabets, parents and family members are offered many opportunities to be involved with your child's education. We encourage you to participate in as many activities as you can!

1. Weekly Homelinks and Family Fun Activities

At Alphabets we believe the connection between home and school is very important. It is proven that children whose families are involved in their school are more successful in their growth and progress academically and socially. Because of this, we strive to involve our families in our curriculum by sending home "Homelinks." These are activities that explain and reinforce the lesson or focus of the school week and expand it past the classroom and into the home.

We encourage all students and their families to participate each week in the Homelink that is sent home. Their creative work is displayed on the lobby bulletin board or in the classroom for all to see which establishes a sense of pride. In addition, we always make the activities fun and engaging for both students and family members.

2. Be a Class Leader

Class Leaders are parents who choose to get involved by volunteering in one of many ways. Family volunteers are family members who participate in events at Alphabets including holiday parties, fundraising events and many other special activities. For each special activity or event a flier is sent to parents via children's mailboxes with a description including dates and times. A Parent Volunteer Sign-Up sheet for each event is hung in the lobby. Sign In sheets are kept as a yearly record of parent volunteers. Families can also get involved by being a Class Representative or a Class Parent. (See next page.)

3. Join the Alphabets Parent Advisory Council / Asbury Park School District Early Childhood Advisory Council

Alphabets Preschool Center offers parents the opportunity to join the Alphabets Parent Advisory Council (APAC). APAC is a place for parents to voice their concerns, share their concerns with other parents and have them heard by people who have the power to make changes. APAC establishes parents as resources and role models to other parents. APAC provides a place where parents can speak openly and without fear, to voice ideas and questions, discuss issues together and to find solutions to problems. Parents are their children's best advocate and APAC aims to teach parents how they can be powerful and make changes that affect their children.

Parents are also invited to participate in the Asbury Park School District Early Childhood Advisory Council. The Early Childhood Advisory Council (ECAC) is a diverse representation of community stakeholders interested in the education and preschool program including community representatives, providers and families. ECAC advises on planning and implementation of the preschool program provides trainings for teachers and families and reviews budgets, priorities reports, enrollment and recruitment. ECAC, also, participates in the assessment of the community needs and resources.

Alphabets Preschool Center is proud to have one full time and one part time Family Outreach Worker (FOW) on our staff. They are here to connect our school to your family.
